GRADES:

Common to all schools: Nx=not at final examination; Inc.=Incomplete; p.w.=permitted to withdraw; r. w.=required to withdraw; Aud.=Auditor.

COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS:—Prior to 1925-26: A=95 to 100; B=85 to 95; C=70 to 85; D=Passing=60 to 70; E=condition=50 to 60; F=failure=below 50. Beginning 1925-26: A=90 to 100; B=80 to 90; C=passing=70 to 80; E=condition=60 to 70; F=failure=below 60. Beginning 1929-30: A=Superior; B=Good; C=Average; D=Pass; F=Failure.

THE SCHOOLS OF ENGINEERING AND ARCHITECTURE:—Prior to 1925-26: 60 to 100=passing; 50 to 60=condition; below 50=failure. Beginning 1925-26: 70 to 100=passing; 60 to 70=condition; below 60=failure. Beginning 1929-30: A=Superior; B=Very Good; C=Fair; D=Passable; F=Failure.

THE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS AND PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION:—Prior to 1925-26: The same as for The College of Liberal Arts for the same period. Beginning 1925-26: 70 to 100=passing; below 70=failure. Beginning 1936-37: Same as for College of Liberal Arts.

THE SCHOOL OF GRADUATE STUDIES:—Prior to 1925-26: A=95 to 100; B=passing=85 to 95; below 85=no credit. Beginning 1925-26: 80 to 100=passing, but an average of 85 is required for recommendation for advanced degrees. Beginning 1929-30: A=Superior; B=Very good; C=Fair; S=Satisfactory, grade at end of year; F=Failure.

THE SUMMER SESSION:—Same as College of Liberal Arts.

THE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE:—Prior to 1925-26: Same as for College of Liberal Arts. Beginning 1925-26: 70 to 100=passing; 60 to 69=condition; below 60=failure; W=withdrew. D=dropped; Nx=no examination; Aud.=Auditor. Beginning 1929-30: Same as for College of Liberal Arts.

CREDIT: Credit is expressed in semester hours. Class periods are 52 minutes, but prior to 1928-29 they were 55 minutes. Laboratory periods are 155 minutes. Each semester is 18 weeks including examinations. The summer session is 6 weeks. The semester in the University College is 15 weeks including examinations.

GRADE POINTS: Effective in the College of Liberal Arts and the Schools of Engineering and Architecture and the School of Business and Public Administration. Beginning 1929-30: A=Superior, carries 3 grade points per credit unit; B=Very Good, carries 2 grade points per credit unit; C=Average, carries 1 grade point per credit unit; D=Pass, carries 0 grade points per credit unit; F=Failure, carries 0 grade points per credit unit. In the School of Graduate Studies: A carries 2 grade points for each unit of credit; B carries 1 grade point for each unit of credit; C carries no grade points. A student shall not be deemed eligible for a degree unless he has a number of grade points equal to or exceeding the number of units of work required for the degree.


During the school year of September 1937 to May 1938, Wm. F. Baggerman was a regularly enrolled student and a member of the class in Insurance Law.
